Discipling Leaders/Building Elders

- **1. Begin a Bible Study for Men –** Include those who desire the office of Elder. Look for availability, a heart for the Word, and teachability
- **2. Teach Biblical Theology –** Give them a solid foundation of doctrine including the doctrine of the church
- **3. Train them to relate biblical theology to life –** This is simply showing them how to solve life's problems and to answer life's questions with scriptural principles.
- **4. Share your heart as well as your mind –** Give them your passion for Christ and His Church. Share you joys and frustrations. Like mindedness necessary for oneness among leaders comes from unity of doctrine and soul.
- 5. Make them feel a part of every significant decision you make You are training them to make decisions in a biblical framework; thus, they will learn to share responsibility.
- **6. Spend time with them individually -** This will weave your personal lives together.
- 7. Confront and admonish them Face their failures with loving encouragement and honesty
- 8. Give them ascending responsibility for areas of ministry all their own This gives them opportunity to develop and prove their leadership skills. Follow this sequence: I did it they watched; I did it they helped; They did it I helped; They did it I watched
- **9. Pray for them –** This will keep them on your heart
- **10. Sacrifice for them -** This lets them know how ,much you love them and how highly you hold their best interests
- **11. Set the example of life for them –** This is the heart of credibility. If you fail everywhere else, a godly example will overcome it. But if you succeed everywhere else, you can't overcome a failure in your life pattern.
