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I. Background

- A. <u>Book level</u> The *who* and *how* of the people of God; Judaizers preaching an anti-grace 'different gospel' (1:6); faith + 'works'/'law' = salvation.
- B. <u>Chapter level</u> arguments for *sola fide*:
 - 1. Personal/experiential (3:1-5)
 - 2. Historical (**6-12**)
 - 3. Christological (13-14)
- C. Paragraph level the law and the promise compared and contrasted (15-22)

- A. The promise > the law (15-18)
 - 1. Illustration terms of will and testament doesn't change; Christ is recipient of promise (15-16)
 - 2. Illustration explained Promise came before law. Therefore, law doesn't annul the promise (17)
 - 3. Summary of point (18)
- B. The purpose of the law (19-20) 'Why then the law?'
 - It puts a name on sin '... because of trangressions'
- C. The promise and the law: their relationship (21-22)
 - 1. Law leaves sense of lifelessness & inability but 'promise by faith' brings life
 - 2. Law leads man to see and seek the 'promise by faith'
