- **1. Bruce Bickel and Titus 2:2**: "Older men are to be sober-minded, dignified, self-controlled, sound in faith, in love, and in steadfastness."
 - "Older men" = presbutes = elder, ambassador
 - In Philemon 1:9, Paul calls himself a *presbutes*, and old man.
 - "Sober-minded" = unaffected by their emotions.
 - "Dignified" = serious and solemn minded, evoking the observation, "That man is serious about his faith."
 - "Self-controlled" = temperate, able to govern yourself. A person that is worthy of respect.
 - "Sound ..." = healthy, in good working order, free from debilitation, uncorrupted.
 - In 1 & 2 Timothy & Titus, and adjective associated with Sound doctrine and teaching.
 - "... in faith" = piste = divine persuasion.
 - "(Sound in ...) love" = agape = divine love, displayed by Jesus on the cross.
 - "(**Sound in ...**) **steadfastness**" = *hupomeno* = lit., waiting under; endurance; patient waiting.
- 2. Are you a help or hinderance to your congregation?

Titus 1's focus: life, leadership and orderliness in the congregation.

- a. Are you showing-up when your congregation meets for worship
 - "We, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another." Romans 12:5.
 - "You are the Body of Christ and individually members of it." 1 Cor 12:27.
 - "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one Body." Col. 3:15.
- b. What is the outcome you expect from showing up?
 - Bible knowledge, inspiration, batteries recharged, good feelings, warm relationships, etc .. for me.
 - Brian H. "I need to find a church where I am comfortable."
- c. From the spiritual gifts God has given you, what are you contributing to congregational life?

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• "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." 1 Cor 12:7

d. How prepared are you for congregational gatherings & worship?

- How much preparation does Bruce do for Bravemen?

e. Are you accountable to the congregation and do you put yourself under congregational authority?

- Are you part of a small group or guided by a spiritual mentor?

f. Are you making a "stretch" or "sacrificial" investment in the success of the congregation?

- Time, talent and treasure.
- Contributing treasure: "You say, 'How have we robbed you (Lord)?' In your tithes and contributions ... Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house." Malachi 3:8, 10

g. Are you prepared to spend time with parishioners and pastors who are irritating, petty, selfish, boring and not up to your standard of Christian maturity?

- "The weak are indispensable ..." 1 Cor 2:22.
- Why are the weak indispensable? Why are the irritating, off-putting indispensable.

h. Will you allow yourself to put up with a certain amount of doctrinal leeway for the sake of the brethren?

- What's essential doctrine: what's less than essential doctrine?
- Norman Geisler's "Essential Doctrine Made Easy". Christ's Body. The Church is not included in 16 essentials!
- It's much easier to be theologically correct rather than self-sacrificial (agape).

i. Are you willing to be patient as the Sovereign God works in you and your congregation?
