Fearing God - Lesson # 11 – Scriptures

Jeremiah 32:40 (NIV84) I will make an everlasting covenant with them: I will never stop doing good to them, and I will inspire them to fear me, so that they will never turn away from me.

Jeremiah 32:39 (NIV84) I will give them singleness of heart and action, so that they will always fear me for their own good and the good of their children after them.

Ezekiel 11:19 (NIV84) I will give them an undivided heart and put a new spirit in them; I will remove from them their heart of stone and give them a heart of flesh.

Ezekiel 36:26 (NIV84) I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh.

Luke 6:43–45 (NIV84) "No good tree bears bad fruit, nor does a bad tree bear good fruit. 44 Each tree is recognized by its own fruit. People do not pick figs from thorn bushes, or grapes from briers. 45 The good man brings good things out of the good stored up in his heart, and the evil man brings evil things out of the overflow of his heart his mouth speaks.

Deuteronomy 6:1–2 (NIV84) These are the commands, decrees and laws the LORD your God directed me to teach you to observe in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to possess, **2** so that you, your children and their children after them may fear the LORD your God as long as you live by keeping all his decrees and commands that I give you, and so that you may enjoy long life.

Deuteronomy 31:12 (NIV84) Assemble the people—men, women and children, and the aliens living in your towns—so they can listen and learn to fear the LORD your God and follow carefully all the words of this law.

Romans 6:17 (NIV84) But thanks be to God that, though you used to be slaves to sin, you wholeheartedly obeyed the form of teaching to which you were entrusted.

2 Timothy 4:2 (NIV84) Preach the Word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction.

Titus 1:9 (NIV84) He must hold firmly to the trustworthy message as it has been taught, so that he can encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it.

Galatians 3:2 (NIV84) I would like to learn just one thing from you: Did you receive the Spirit by observing the law, or by believing what you heard?

Hebrews 11:7 (NIV84) By faith Noah, when warned about things not yet seen, in holy fear built an ark to save his family. By his faith he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.

2 Corinthians 7:10–11 (NIV84) 10 Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death. **11** See what this godly sorrow has produced in you: what earnestness, what eagerness to clear yourselves, what indignation, what alarm, what longing, what concern, what readiness to see justice done. At every point you have proved yourselves to be innocent in this matter. **Psalm 130:3–4 (NIV84)** If you, O LORD, kept a record of sins, O Lord, who could stand?**4** But with you there is forgiveness; therefore you are feared.

Jeremiah 33:8–9 (NIV84) I will cleanse them from all the sin they have committed against me and will forgive all their sins of rebellion against me. **9** Then this city will bring me renown, joy, praise and honor before all nations on earth that hear of all the good things I do for it; and they will be in awe and will tremble at the abundant prosperity and peace I provide for it.'

Psalm 119:120 (NIV84) My flesh trembles in fear of you; I stand in awe of your laws.

Deuteronomy 13:11 (NIV84) Then all Israel will hear and be afraid, and no one among you will do such an evil thing again.

Deuteronomy 4:9–11 (NIV84) Only be careful, and watch yourselves closely so that you do not forget the things your eyes have seen or let them slip from your heart as long as you live. Teach them to your children and to their children after them. **10** Remember the day you stood before the LORD your God at Horeb, when he said to me, "Assemble the people before me to hear my words so that they may learn to revere me as long as they live in the land and may teach them to their children." **11** You came near and stood at the foot of the mountain while it blazed with fire to the very heavens, with black clouds and deep darkness.

Titus 3:3–7 (NIV84) At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another. **4** But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, **5** he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, **6** whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, **7** so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life.

Luke 16:15 (NIV84) He said to them, "You are the ones who justify yourselves in the eyes of men, but God knows your hearts. What is highly valued among men is detestable in God's sight.

1 Peter 1:17 (NIV84) Since you call on a Father who judges each man's work impartially, live your lives as strangers here in reverent fear.
