- Rom. 9:22 ²² What if God, desiring to show his wrath and to make known his power, has endured with much patience vessels of wrath prepared for destruction,
- I Peter 3:20 ²⁰ because they formerly did not obey, when God's patience waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through water.
- II Peter 3:15 ¹⁵ And count the patience of our Lord as salvation, just as our beloved brother Paul also wrote to you according to the wisdom given him,
- Deut. 32:35 35 Vengeance is mine, and recompense, for the time when their foot shall slip; for the day of their calamity is at hand, and their doom comes swiftly.'
- Rom. 12:12 12 Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer.
- Heb. 10:30 ³⁰ For we know him who said, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay." And again, "The Lord will judge his people."
