1. The OT is the word of God and it lasts forever.

"<u>All Scripture</u> is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God <u>may be complete</u>, equipped for every good work." 1 Timothy 3:16.

"The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever." Isiah 40:8.

"Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." Matt 4:4.

"Do not think that <u>I have come to abolish</u> (overthrow, unloose) the Law or the Prophets but <u>to fulfill</u> (complete, carry into effect) them." Matthew 5:17.

2. Why should New Covenant people study Old Covenant Scripture?

- a. The LORD, through human authors, "breathed" the OT.
- b. "Blessed is the man ... (whose) delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night." Psalm 1:1-2.
- c. "Everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets, and the Psalms must be fulfilled." Luke 24:44.

3. A convenient way to think about the Bible: Creation, Fall and Redemption

- a. Redemption is through the Covenant (a binding agreement) of the LORD with his people:
 - i. "Party of the 1st part": "I will be your God and you will be my people" if ...
 - ii. "Party of the 2nd part": The Lord appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless ..." (Genesis 17:1)
 "I am the Lord your God. Consecrate yourselves therefore, and be holy, for I am holy." Leviticus 11:44.
 - iii. Summary of the Covenant. "Obey my voice, and I will be your God, and you shall be my people. And walk in all the way that I command you, that it may be well with you." Jer. 7:22f

4. Redemption through the "party of the 2nd part" keeping, perfectly, all that God commands.

5. Compelling reasons to study the OT

- a. The sheer weight of material: 76% of the 30,000 Bible verses are found in the OT.
- b. In the OT we learn the answer to the three most important questions: Who is God? Who am I? what does God expect of me?

- **6. Answering the Three Questions from Exodus.** "Who is like you, O Lord, among the gods? Who is like you, majestic in holiness, awesome in glorious deeds, doing wonders?" Exodus 15:11
 - a. **God's name.** "Moses said to God, 'Suppose I go to the Israelites ... and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them? ¹⁴ God said to Moses, 'I Am who I Am.'" Exodus. 3:13-15
 - b. God's attributes.
 - i. Holiness: kodesh = set-apart, consecrated, sacred. Also: without contradiction.
 - "Then (God) said, 'Do not come near; take your sandals off your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." Exodus. 3:5. "... Majestic in holiness ..."
 - ii. **Glory** (*kabod*); from the root word for *heavy*, *weighty*.
 - "Moses was not able to enter the tent of meeting because the cloud settled on it, and the glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle." Ex. 40:35
 - iii. God's other attributes summarized in Exodus 34:6-7. "(The LORD) passed in front of Moses and proclaimed, 'The LORD, the LORD, a God ...
 - Merciful ... (not getting what one deserve).
 - *Gracious* ... (in the sense of *hearing a debtor's cry*).
 - *Slow to anger* ... (root word = "flared nostrils").
 - o abounding in Steadfast Love (hesed) ... and Faithfulness ...
 - keeping Steadfast Love (hesed) for the thousandth generation ...
 - Forgiving (lifting, carrying) iniquity, transgression and sin ...
 - but who will by no means clear (cleaned/emptied) the guilty. Justice
 - c. **God's people.** "Although the whole earth is mine, <u>you will be for me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation</u>." Exodus. 19:5-6. "In your unfailing love <u>you will lead the people you have redeemed</u>. In your strength you will guide them to your holy dwelling." Exodus 15:13
 - d. **God's redemption.** "Israel is my firstborn son ... I am the Lord, and <u>I will bring you out from under the yoke</u> of the Egyptians. <u>I will free you from being slaves to them, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with mighty acts of judgment." Exodus 4:22; 6:6</u>
 - e. God's Law and laws. "Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left ..." Joshua 1:7
 - f. God's worship. 'The Lord ... has sent me to say to you: <u>Let my people go, so that they may worship me</u> ..." Exodus 7:16. "Moses led the people out of the camp <u>to meet with God</u>, and they stood at the foot of the mountain." Exodus 19:17. "The tent of meeting, where <u>I</u> will meet with you. It shall be most holy to you." Exodus 30:36
 - g. **God's mediator.** Moses mediates with pharaoh and with God. "The Lord said to Moses, 'Come up to me on the mountain and stay here, and I will give you the tablets of stone with the law and commandments I have written for their instruction." Exodus. 24:12
